Supported by Museums Galleries Scotland, The Moray Society is looking to offer sessional work to a suitably qualified and experienced individual (or individuals) who will provide heritage-themed activities to children, young people, and other community groups. We wish to increase the interest and participation of people in the heritage of the Moray area, making use of the resources of Elgin Museum, and build our capacity as we recover from the effects of the Covid pandemic.

Elgin Museum is Scotland's oldest continuously independent museum. It is owned and operated by the Moray Society, a membership society whose main aims are to protect and promote the heritage of Moray. The Museum houses a wide range of artefacts and displays representing the story of the local area including archaeological artefacts, a Recognised Collection of fossils, a Pictish stone collection and ethnographic objects brought home from abroad. We wish to increase the accessibility of the collections for people of all ages and to stimulate their interest and pride in their local heritage and museum.

The sessional worker should be able to work independently and have strong interpersonal skills to liaise successfully with people of all ages from schools and colleges, heritage, community, and young people's organisations in Moray. They should be able to communicate effectively with professionals and museum volunteers. They should have strong digital skills, competent in using standard Office software and having experience of running successful social media accounts. Experience in developing and using online content and activities would be desirable, Experience working in both an educational and museum environment will be essential. In particular, the candidate will have enthusiasm for engaging with and

working with young people and will help develop the range of activities available to them.

The candidate should be educated to degree or equivalent level in a subject area relevant for work in a museum environment or be able to show comparable relevant experience if a degree has not been awarded. A current driving licence will be beneficial as travel throughout Moray may be needed. The appointee will be required to pass a PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) disclosure check.

Post Title: Sessional Education and Outreach Support Worker

This post is self employed

Purpose of Post:

The post involves using Elgin Museum's collections as a learning and engagement resource. The appointee(s) will develop and deliver a high quality and dynamic programme of learning and participation for classes, groups, and individuals to increase the number of people engaging with, and benefiting from, Elgin Museum's resources. Activities and events should have a strong connection to the Museum's collections and local heritage and should take account of the Museum and Moray Society's overarching aims and objectives. It is expected that activities will be delivered face-to-face but, should Covid-19 restrictions be reintroduced, online activities, digital content and social media will become the main vehicles of delivery.

Key Tasks:

The appointee will be required to fulfil the following tasks:

- To increase existing opportunities for community engagement in Moray within a museum context, using the Museum's collections as the main focus of activity
- To liaise with colleges, schools, and other youth groups to create events and opportunities to appeal to young people in both informal and formal learning situations
- To facilitate activities in the local community in response to requests from schools and community groups
- To develop age-appropriate online (downloadable) and video activities, and online showcasing of the Museum's collections in the event of Covid-19 restrictions being reintroduced
- To engage with currently under-represented groups of people to promote their engagement with the museum
- To maintain and manage records appropriate to the activity and any budget requirements, reporting to the Project Leader who is accountable to the Convenor of Elgin Museum Management Committee
- Be aware of relevant health & safety issues, and of Elgin Museum's policies and procedures
- Any other task related to community engagement identified by the Project Leader or by the Convenor of Elgin Museum Management Committee
