JOB PURPOSE

The role of Trainee Archaeologist is a fantastic opportunity for an archaeolgy graduate to learn and gain professional experience. The role has a remit to support the work of the Trust's Archaeology Department in all areas of conservation, research and promotion of Scotland's material culture (artefacts, buildings, archaeology sites and landscapes). Working with Trust Staff, Volunteers and a range of External Stakeholders you will help deliver archaeological fieldwork in our mission to care for some of Scotland's most significant landscapes. You will learn to design and implement archaeological investigations from prehistory to the post-medieval period and learn to deliver engaging community focused excavations to a safe and ethically professional standard.

The Trainee Archaeologist will also study for a Scottish Vocational Qualification (SVQ) Level 6 in Archaeological Practice with the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists (CIfA). This is to support the development of a proven portfolio of hands-on skills and to address the widely recognised graduate skills gap within the archaeology industry. With the wider aim of contributing to the growth of the talent-pool of future archaeologists in Scotland and the UK.

The Traineeship will be run in partnership with CIfA, who will support the successful candidate through their SVQ, undertaking regular observations to allow the apprentice to meet the necessary evidence requirements.
